3 Days Workshop




CELEBRATING INDEPENDENCE DAY AND TIRANGA YATRA

This hands-on experience was led by expert instructors, making the learning interactive and impactful. Our students are now not just academically proficient but also capable of responding to real-life situations with calm and care.










ONLINE WEBINAR: NATIONAL OZONE DAY

strong but subtle, making it a story of resilience and strength without being overtly didactic.








WORKSHOP ON MIND PROGRAMMING & LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT






GANDHI JAYANTI CELEBRATION

- 1. - The idea that environmental conservation starts with individual responsibility and collective action.








AWARENESS SESSION ON HEALTHY MIND PLATTER ON WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY


a thorough understanding of how to create, distribute, and assess interactive exercises using this tool.


















AWARENESS SESSION ON "HYGIENE-DENGUE PREVENTION"








WORKSHOP ON MINDFULLNESS














FRESHERS PARTY






POSCO ACT

- 3. To empower participants with knowledge about reporting mechanisms and victim support systems.










CYBER CRIME
