In the show, all the athletes shared factors that motivated them throughout their sports journey. Despite being Specially abled, the confidence and morale of these athletes were no less than those of a fully fit athlete. They also shared their hardships at the rock bottom of their careers. Sweeti Boora also talked about the lack of opportunities for women in villages, one of the main reasons India is not performing well in the Olympics despite being one of the most populated countries. Murlikant Patekar, on whom the movie “Chandu Champion” was made recently, talked about the roadmap of being a successful athlete. He was recently awarded the Arjuna Award for his contribution to the sport. The audience also took part in the show by asking their queries and questions of the guests and getting guidance from the game stars. The show ended by honoring the guests with a DD national podium and providing refreshments as lunch to all the members in the hall.

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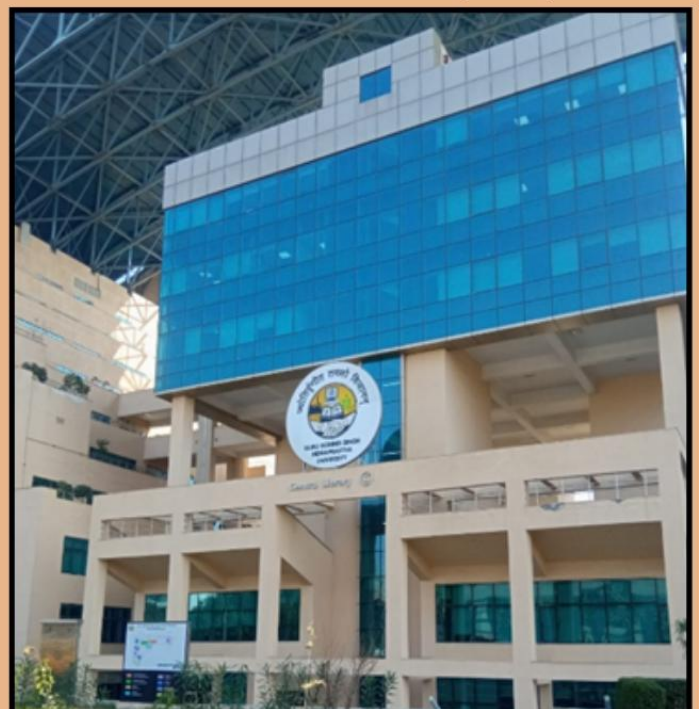
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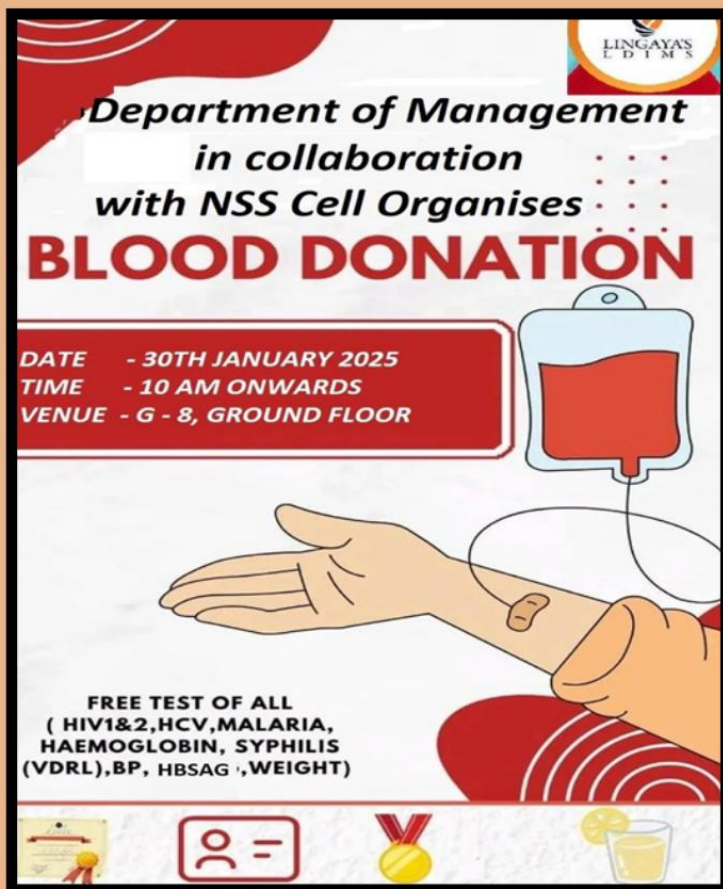
On January 28, 2025, the Vice Chancellor Conference Hall at GGSIPU's East Campus hosted the release of the admission brochure for the 2025-2026 academic session. The event, attended by faculty, press members, and reporters, aimed to inform students about key developments at the university. Professor (Dr.) Mahesh Verma, Vice Chancellor of GGSIPU, highlighted several initiatives to enhance the student experience, including introducing a Moot Court and Robotics Lab, improving infrastructure with increased water harvesting facilities, and launching a new Ph.D. program and a Pharmacy College. The university also expands language courses, offers a Vice Translator Internship, and promotes sustainability through a Green Revolution.

Additionally, efforts are being made to increase international student enrollment, with students expected from 31 countries. New initiatives include bi-annual admissions, a research award program, and the establishment of an Animal House for biological sciences research. GGSIPU is also adding a new campus in Narela, collaborating with Ideacon Company to foster innovation, and introducing schemes like the Single Girl Child Seat and Sports Kota for reserved student seats. During the event, Professor Queeny Pradhan, Dean of the University School of Liberal Arts, and Dr. DurgeshTripathi, Dean of Journalism and Mass Communication, provided insights into the university's ongoing growth. This informative session was covered by Vanshika Virmani (reporter) and Tanishka Tomar(camera person), providing valuable insights for our college, LLDIMS.

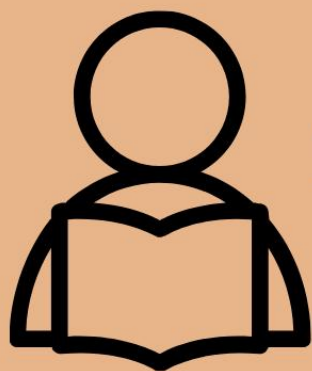
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
